WHO ARE WE?

- WE ARE MEMBERS OF THE BLACK LADIES ADVOCATING FOR CANCER CARE (BLACC) STEERING COMMITTEE. OUR GROUP IS WORKING WITH THE OFFICE OF COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (OCE) FROM STANFORD UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF MEDICINE. WE STARTED WORKING TOGETHER IN 2018 WITH THE GOAL OF IMPROVING THE CARE AND OUTCOMES OF AFRICAN AMERICAN BREAST CANCER PATIENTS. OUR PARTNERSHIP IS WORKING TO CREATE A BREAST CANCER PEER NAVIGATION PROGRAM BASED ON THE LIVED EXPERIENCES OF AFRICAN AMERICAN BREAST CANCER PATIENTS AND SURVIVORS, FOCUSING ON THEIR NEEDS DURING THE PERI-DIAGNOSTIC PERIOD.

WHAT IS A STORYTELLING INTERVIEW?

- AN OPPORTUNITY TO SHARE ABOUT YOUR BREAST CANCER JOURNEY
- WE WILL USE STORYTELLING TO COLLECT DATA THAT WILL INFORM THE CREATION OF A PEER NAVIGATION PROGRAM BY AND FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN. THE GOAL OF THE STORYTELLING SESSIONS IS TO UNDERSTAND AFRICAN AMERICAN WOMEN'S EXPERIENCE DURING THE PERIDIAGNOSTIC PERIOD, IDENTIFY COMMON BARRIERS AND ASSETS, AND UNCOVER OPPORTUNITIES WHERE PEER NAVIGATION CAN ADDRESS BARRIER.
