HOW WE GOT HERE

WHAT WE SAW

There was a need for peer navigation programs that have been developed by and for African American women.

OUR FOCUS

While peer navigation throughout the cancer care continuum is a priority, the partnership identified the peridiagnostic period as their initial focus.

WHY?

African American women are more likely than non-Hispanic white women to experience delays in treatment.

WITH YOUR HELP

We will gather input on clinical and nonclinical needs of African American breast cancer patients that can be used to adapt existing peer navigation programs for the breast cancer peridiagnostic period for African American women.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- **<u>Program goal:</u>** Develop a Peer Navigator Program specifically for African American women addressing access, resources and total health care during their treatment journey.
- <u>**Timeline:**</u> 18-month project
- <u>Funder:</u> University of California, Office of the President- California Breast Cancer Research Program
 - CBCRP is the largest state-funded breast cancer research effort in the nation and is administered by the Research Grants Program Office within the University of California Office of the President.
 - Works to eliminate breast cancer by leading innovation in research, communication and collaboration in the California scientific and lay communities

PEER NAVIGATION WORK FLOW PROCESS

Team Work

Stanford OCE, BLACC Steering Committee and the CAB members will work together to gather information that will help to create a peer navigation program for African American women with breast cancer.

Storytelling

Together we will hold storytelling sessions with African American breast cáncer survivors and caregivers.


Short Term Goal

With the information we gain from the story telling sessions, we hope to have a better understanding of the African American women's experience during the peri-diagnostic period. Our goal is to use that to create a manual for a African American peer navigation program for the peri-diagnostic period.

Long Term Goal

Build a culturally-centered peer navigation program and improve breast cancer outcomes for African American women.

Throughout the process you will be developing plans to communicate with family members and friends, identifying ways to overcome barriers, providing recommendations and acting as a community referral specialist.
